Bishop Melvin Lambert of Overcoming Church and New Birth Ministries in Fayetteville, NC, began his teaching.

“The worst place to be,” he told the congregation, “is a place where God was. The building is not the church. It’s just a venue. The people are the church. The building cannot go stand in front of Wal-Mart and witness to people but NEXT LEVEL can.

“When God breathes, he doesn’t breathe oxygen. He exhales his word. ‘Let us make man in our image.’ We were on God’s mind before we came out his mouth. We tap into a dimension that the world cannot tap into.

The you that came from God’s mind is not the same you that your daddy gave your mother. The you that came from God’s mind is the same you that Nicodemus struggled with. The you

that came out of God’s mouth is not the same as the you born into this world. So, the spiritual birth is not the same as natural birth. The outward man is the house for the inner man. Anyone in the earthly realm without a body is in the earthly realm illegally. In Gen 1:26-27 God made the decision. In Gen 2:7, ‘And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground.’ This was the natural birth of the man. Also in Gen 2:7, ‘And breathed into his nostrils’

“The clay was the forming of the outer man. Then God placed the inner man inside the outer man when he breathed into his nostrils.

“Jesus was talking to Nicodemus about the inner man. Nicodemus had the right concept but the wrong womb.
“Why do we have to be born again? Because every one of us was placed inside Adam and when he fell, so did we. This is why ‘If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature.’ If the inner man be in Christ, the inner man is a new creature.”

After the sermon the bishop prayed over several people, including Pastor Larry Pruet, Pastor Hoard, and Pastor Betty Arnold. He told each one of them, “Replenish the earth, be fruitful and multiply.”

The three-day event was worth attending.

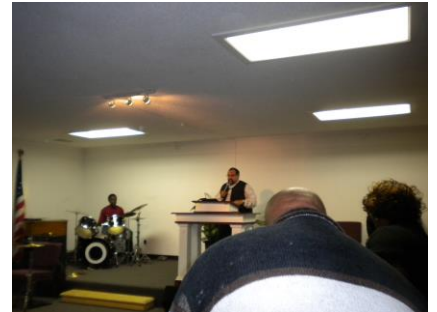

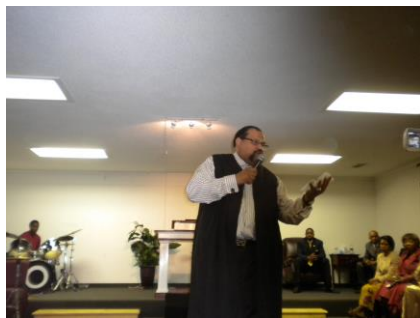

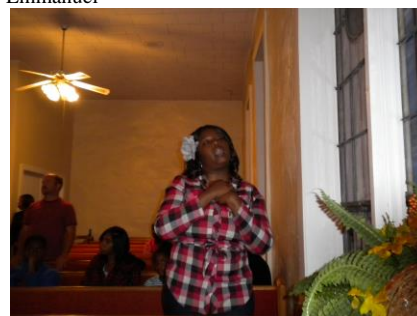
took an overdose of drugs to end it. Her mother took her to the hospital, where they said she would not live to see the morning. “Thank God I had a praying mother.” She told us.

Pastor Mayweather began his sermon from Matthew 14:36, “And besought him that they might only touch the hem of his garment: and as many as touched him were made perfectly whole.” “Have you touched him? Can y’all receive from a young man today?”

“When are the church folks gonna go out and say, ‘Hey I know a man named Jesus?’ Who is this man that touched the lame and they walked? His name is Jesus. He was like all of us but there was something about this man named Jesus. He preached the gospel and said, ‘Bring me the sick, not the well.’ Stop grabbing the church folks and dragging them to church. Bring the lost folks.

“The woman with the issue of blood had to touch him. She said, ‘I see a man: Jesus. No crack cocaine can stop me. No woman, no man can stop me. No alcohol can stop me. I got to touch Jesus.’

“When a demon saw Jesus, he said, ‘I got to go.’ He didn’t hang around. Look at your neighbor and say, ‘Have you touched him?’

“Once you touch the hem of his garment, you can love like Christ loves. You can love those without titles, love the young man wearing his pants sagging, help him in love. Touch the hem of his garment. He went to the cross for love. Touch the hem of his garment.

“It’s time for God’s people to come together. When we get in one mind set, we’ll go get the lost and start a real revival.

The Whole Body of Christ Alliance

I find the Whole Body of Christ Alliance to be a wonderful thing. As times get harder, the nearer the return of Christ, the more important it will be. We seem to have a hard time overcoming the idea of individual cells, which is what each church becomes separately. The alliance is not a new idea, as there are alliances all over the U.S, and probably the world. I know of another one in the Toccoa, Georgia area, and another one in Tennessee. There will come a time in the very near future that we will need to pull together to meet the needs of the people in our churches. The time is coming when, if we stand for Christ, we may be cut off from the supplies we need to survive. We may need to be like the slaves that used the underground network of people for supplies and transportation to obtain and keep their freedom. This will be extremely difficult if we don’t have an intimate knowledge of all the churches and people in the body of Christ and what they can do or supply for the needs of the group.

As of the time of the writing of this article we have three ways to accomplish this getting to know one another in the alliance. We have the Battlefield News, which comes out once a month; there are the coffee houses, of which there are two that open every month; and there are the seven-day revivals at seven different churches with seven different pastors preaching, not at their church, but at the host church, which occur every three months. The next one is scheduled for the 16th through the 22nd of January.

What troubles me is the lack of interest in these things. The coffee houses are averaging about 40 people each night they open. The last revival averaged about 35 people per night. If only five people showed up from each church for any of these, there would be 175 people attending. Only five people and we would pack out most of the host churches. Last but not least are the finances required to fund the Battlefield News. It costs about \$220.00 to print 350 copies of a 16-page magazine. This past month it was short \$157.00 and we took up an offering at Missy’s Coffee House to help with it. If each ministry would just give \$10.00 per month there would be \$350 toward the printing. I personally use the paper to try to show the unsaved how Jesus can work in people’s lives. This should not be a

burden on God’s people as we should be putting him first above all else. My wife Rhonda and I personally have only missed four nights out of three sets of revivals. She has missed only one coffee house, and, so far, I have missed none. We do not find it a burden to support the alliance, nor is it a burden to do the work of God.

If we as churches are going to follow the directive of the Bible – to come together as one church, if are going to pledge to participate in the alliance, we should put forth the effort to get the news out to people in our congregations and encourage them to participate in these events and get to know each other as members of an alliance, to be at home in each other’s church buildings, and not stay hiding in our individual cells, we call our churches. Pray about it.

If you step out of your comfort zone, you will want to **stay** in his presence. You don't need 12 steps. All you need is one step – Isaiah 43:1. 'You are mine.'

"When Jesus came, he left the 99 to find Russell. He said, 'He is mine. I created him in my image.'

"Rejoice that your name is written in the lamb's book of life. If it is not, tonight is the night for that to change.

"In Isaiah 43:2 we see, 'When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned.' Nebuchadnezzar saw four men in the fire in Daniel 3:25, when he threw only three in there.

"What do Mohammed, Buddha, and Confucius have in common? They're all dead. I don't serve a dead God. I serve a risen savior.

"Mary found favor with God and he sent her the seed. She held onto that promise – that seed. You have a promise from God and a day goes by and nothing happens, then a week, still nothing. What if your seed is an oak tree? You hold your position. I'm not worried about the devil. It's the church folks I'm worried about. Everybody is called by God, not just your pastor. You are all called. What is **your** calling? God is tired of excuses. Too many are saved from the neck up. Faith without works is dead. God created good works for us to accomplish, not excuses. God requires action, not holy-sounding talk.

He was also surrounded by darkness but it was far below him. He is in a clean white robe. I felt myself there and the Lord poured oil over my head. It ran down my back, down my face into my beard and into my eyes.

I saw the dirty little boy again, then the clean boy dancing with the Lord, then the man

worshipping. There was an equilibrium between them all and they were all at the same time.

The others in the sanctuary were as deep in worship as I was. I remembered that I was supposed to be taking notes and photos. I rose from the floor and walked to the back of the sanctuary to see something that made the tears in my eyes thicken. It was Matt Pritchett dancing with his grand daughter just as the Lord had been dancing with me, the small boy.
