# On Prayer 77 Blessing Others (Part Three)

We can observe this principle again in Genesis 27, where Ya'akov (Jacob) cheated his brother Esav (Esau) out of his blessing. Yitzchak (Isaac) was old and about to die, and his eyesight was shot in his old age. At his mother's prompting, and with her help, Ya'akov took advantage of his father's condition. He pretended to be Esav in order to obtain his older brother's blessing. Rebekah prepared the kind of meal Esau would've prepared for Yitzchak, his father, and Jacob wore animal skins that his mother had made in order to deceive his father. Esau came in shortly after Isaac blessed Ya'akov: "Yitzchak trembled exceedingly, and said, 'Who? Where is the one who hunted game and brought it to me? I ate all of it before you came, and I have blessed him - and indeed he shall be blessed.' When Esav heard the words of his father, he cried with an exceedingly great and bitter cry, and said to his father, 'Bless me, even me also, O my father!' But he said, 'Your brother came in deceit and has taken away your blessing' - Gen

This is an amazing passage because even though Ya'akov received the blessing under false pretenses, and Isaac pronounced it under duress, Isaac said, 'I can't reverse it. I have blessed him, and indeed, he will be blessed!' This blessing imparted by Yitzchak was so powerful that it changed the course of history, affecting the destiny of the Arabs and the Israelis. Whole nations were affected.

As I read the chapter of Genesis in my quiet time, I closed my Bible in near disbelief that blessings could be that powerful. I shared this discovery with my husband Richard. As it so often happens, we had both read this passage several times and never seen the significance of this blessing. He was so excited that he went into his staff meeting and shared this principle with the whole staff. Then we went into the sanctuary and blessed everyone connected with an area of ministry. The music minister blessed all the people in the music groups, and the youth leader blessed all the youth workers and teenage youth leaders. We blessed home group leaders, secretaries, elders, and deacons.

If Christians have this kind of power in blessing (and the above passage proves it), then we have missed something very important. We have missed a **specialized way to pray** seldom taught to or grasped by the average Christian. We have the power to impart blessings to people that will change them permanently and alter their destiny.

Rom 10:17 tells us, "Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word or God." It is easy to misunderstand this statement, as one cane see aside from the fact that it is written in Middle English. Literally, it sounds like it is based on the fact that many people in the first century, the time of the apostle Paul, were illiterate and had to have the word read to them. It also sounds in the literal sense that our sense of hearing comes from the word of God ("...and hearing by the word of God."). Although in the first century, when Paul dictated the book of Romans to Tertius to write down, a great many of the people did have to have the word of God read to them, don't forget that the New Testament, as we know it, did not exist. A better explanation of this is that faith comes from hearing the word of God preached, and that the preaching must come from the word of God. This explanation causes it to make more sense, but many people have a difficult time seeing how their faith can come from hearing some one preach. I had a problem seeing that myself for quite some time. Then I did a little research and discovered that it was simply a matter of not understanding what the apostle Paul meant. I looked in Strong's concordance to make sure of the word "word." I

found that the actual Greek word is not "logos," the written word of God - in other words, the Bible but "rhema," the spoken word of God. Now I can see it. If God speaks to me, - I'm not talking about something I read in the Bible; but if he actually speaks to me - then I have to believe and my faith quickly climbs to new heights.

There are quite a few of my Christian Brothers, whom I love very much, who do not believe that God actually speaks to us in any way except through his written word. One even implied that the Bible says otherwise. I love him very much and I will not get into a debate about this difference in beliefs, but not only does the Bible not say otherwise, but there are numerous examples in the Bible that say exactly that. Making a convincing case for this principle is beyond the scope of this article, which is to explain faith, but I will simply give one example: Jer 33:3, "Call to me and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things that you do not know.'

God does speak to us. That is why good prayer is communication, not just me speaking to God. I really would like to go into this more deeply, and I may do that in the future, but for now, suffice it to say that when God does actually speak to you, your faith will increase.

To illustrate this, let's look at what was already said: that reason, logic, and faith are on one side, while emotions and imagination are on the other side. Now that we know this, we can see what goes on with Christianity.

Rom 5:8, "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (NIV)

Rom 10:9-10, "If you acknowledge publicly with your mouth that Yeshua is Lord and trust in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be delivered. For with the heart one goes on trusting and thus continues toward righteousness, while with the mouth one keeps on making public acknowledgment and thus continues toward deliverance." (JNT)

Rom 10:13, "for whosoever shall call upon the

name of the Lord shall be saved." (KJV)

John 5:24, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that heareth my word and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation, but is passed from death unto life."

Ask the person, "If you died now, do you know for sure you would go to Heaven?"

"Would you like to know?"

"If I showed you in the Bible how you could know, would you be willing to do what the Bible savs?

Show him he is a sinner. Rom 3:10 & 3:23.

Show him the price of sin. Rom 6:23

Review it all to be sure he understands.

If you see that he is ready, ask him if he would be willing to ask God to save him.

If he is not ready, just ask him if you can have a word of prayer for him.

Ask him to pray.

Say, "If you mean it in your heart and you are right now receiving Jesus Christ as your personal Lord & savior, would you take my hand?" This helps seal it in his mind.

Pray once more and thank God for saving him. Show him John 5:24

Ask him again, "Where, according to the Bible, would you go if you died?'

Talk to him about baptism and get a commitment. You can explain that there is more to it than just claiming it; he must take certain actions if he wants to keep what he has just received. Pick him up Sunday (or whatever day is the soonest that you can get him to a church). Bring him forward in the service. Get him to commit to Sunday school or a weekly Bible study. It is so important that you do not lead him through "the Sinner's Prayer" and just leave him there, telling him he is now saved. You must follow up or you have accomplished nothing.

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### Trust that is Unshakeable

One of the definitions for trust is: firm belief in the reliability, truth, ability, or strength of someone or something. Firm belief, in my opinion, is firm faith, which equals trust. When it comes to trusting a person it's a lot harder for us because we get our feelings, emotions, and our logical minds involved. come together with black churches, Hispanic churches with other Hispanic churches, whites with whites, Baptist churches, Methodist, Presbyterian, Pentecostal churches all coming together with churches like themselves. This is **not** unity in the body of Christ. It is this same sort of mindset that makes us want to make Jesus be like us. Many white people say he's white, but he is not. Many blacks say he is black, but he is not. When the Lord was here on earth, he was not a Baptist, nor an Anglican, not Methodist. In fact, he was not even a Christian: he was a Jew.

"People, we have to stop trying to make Jesus be like us and focus on becoming like him - wanting what he wants, working for what he did, weeping over what he wept over.

"What I have seen in the body of Christ, mostly among denominations, is never a preacher from one denomination preaching on the pulpit of another denomination - never, that is, until the Whole Body of Christ Alliance. What I have seen in the body of Christ, regardless of denomination, is a pessimistic paranoia that makes pastors act terrified that, if they allow someone to speak in their church who says something that they are not saying, God is going to get them. Pastors, Unity in the body is far more important to the Lord (see John 17) than some piece of misplaced doctrine.

In addition, your 'sheep' are not as stupid as you might think; if you disagree with a speaker's doctrine, just tell your people.

"I have seen this pessimistic Paranoia stand in the way of real unity time and time again. Think about it, Presbyterians: Do you really believe that Presbyterians are the only ones that will be in the kingdom of God? Baptists, do you think there is a Baptist section of heaven? AME Zion people, do you think the Lord is going to segregate the AME Zion folks over here and the Nazarenes over there, the Church of God in Christ on that block and the Fire Baptized Holiness on the next block?

The body of Christ has many pastors, or churches, or people that act as if they believe that they are the only ones who have the truth, and no one else does. If you believe that, whoever you are, you are deceived by the forces of darkness. If you are at a church that professes they have the truth and no one else does, be very wary, and do not drink the kool-aid.

"The truth of the matter is that no denomination, no church, no pastor, no one person has the whole truth, and we are not going to get it until we come together as the Lord prayed about in John 17. Folks, lets throw that pessimistic paranoia down right now before it becomes an appendage that can only be removed through surgery. I will repeat something I have already said: The Lord holds unity with each other far more important than anyone's pet doctrine. Yes, pastors, you will be held accountable, but it is far better to err on the side of working to achieve unity in love than erring on the side of isolating from the rest of the body because you are afraid someone is going to tell your people something you don't agree with, or because you or your denomination have the truth and no one else does.

I have heard some of the pastors who seem to espouse the pessimistic paranoia tell their people to "Come out from among them," speaking about others in the body of Christ that are not part of their church or denomination. They are quoting from Is 52:11 ('Go out from the midst of her'). The problem with this is that the word of God does not tell us to come out from among others in the body of Christ, but from the world.

"Most people don't fit into this extreme. So many are just indifferent.

"You do not have to be a pastor or elder, or apostle, prophet or evangelist. You don't have to be anything in particular, except a lover of God, to work to build his kingdom. All a person has to do is visit another church once a month or so. If you are part of a WBCA church, tell your pastor what you saw at the church you visited. Some one will take it from there. There now, was that difficult? Stay with us, folks. We will not stop building the kingdom of God."

"We use the word 'saved.' In Greek the word is sozo (pron sode zoe). In Rom 10:1, & 9 -13, the apostle Paul uses the word 'saved' three times, but the Greek words there are different. In Rom 10:9 & 13, the word is sosthenes (pron sose-then-ace), it means safe & strength. In 10:1 it is soteria (pron so-tay-ree-ah), which means to save, rescue, deliver, safety, health, salvation, saving. This is the meaning we are usually concerned with.

"It means whole, healed, restored, delivered. Every sickness and disease has to go because that is part of what Jesus accomplished on that cross. Scripture says he made us whole. But we have to we have to walk out the wholeness. When God the Father looks at us, it is through his son. Therefore, he sees us as his son. We are the righteousness of Christ

"In life we get damaged, but part of our soteria is restoration. Is 53:5-10, Jesus took everything we deserved. Therefore, we shall have soteria. We broke the law and deserved the curse, but he took that for us. When Adam and Khawvah (Eve) sinned, the fellowship with God was broken. Jesus restored that relationship with the Father. He saved us to put that relationship back.

"Before the foundation of the world, God knew man would sin. When he saved us, he said, 'don't worry; I got ya.' He restored that relationship. We do not have to go to a priest to confess anything; Jesus is our Cohen Gadol - our High Priest. He wants us to praise him. The Bible says we're commanded to. If you want to see him move, raise him. The Father wanted to have that relationship back. That's why Jesus went to the cross.

The Father is only a prayer away. He wants us to thank him, to praise him. I don't want some rocks crying out for me; I will praise him.

"If we want the full benefit of that wholeness, we have to walk out the wholeness.

"In I Sam 30: 6, David first found strength in the Lord his God. Then he asked God what to do and everything was recovered.

"Jesus did the work on Golgotha and he deserves every ounce of the praise. No matter what battle you face, he will be there with you. God will move in our circumstances when we praise him. After all he did, the least you can do is praise him.

"When people make me angry, I think, 'What did Jesus do?' He did all that for me; the least I could do is praise him. He wakes me up at 0200 and I praise him, talk to him. If we are not praising him, praying, and reading his word, we are missing it. That is why the church in America is in such bad shape. Nothing I am going through compares to what he went through. He rose victorious on the third day, and we will be victorious as long as we lift our hands and praise him.

Knowing the Hebrew and Greek is so important to understanding his word. If you don't know it, learn how to find it and you will understand better than

vou ever have."

of Christ Alliance. Let us never allow it to be changed. We are named what we have been for good reason. Don't allow anyone to change your name. My name is Joseph, not Joe. Pastor Angel - I love it. Pastor Rick has done a good work; he has brought together over fifty churches. What can I contribute to make it better? Where would we meet like this without the alliance? God brought this man and a lot of blessings to this alliance. "When Jesus

prayed in John 17 for unity, he gave us a map to work toward in one accord. Carry your Bible into church, not your cell phone. The first text book in America was the Bible. When any school or university was built, the first room made was the chapel. Now our children are going to schools and universities with wicked professors and wicked teachers. I meet people who treat the Bible like any ordinary book, or even like rubbish because of going to one of those schools. Our children have been influenced by these wicked institutions now for some years and now it is reflected in their very physical appearance. Lev 19:28 says do not get tattoos, 'You shall not make any cuttings on your flesh for the dead, nor print any marks upon you.' Yet it is almost impossible in America to find a person under forty with tattoos.

'Why do nearly all young people have them? It is because most of the preachers are afraid to tell them. They will tell you, 'Everybody does it.' They will tell you, 'That's Old Testament.' Well, II Tim is New Testament and it says 'all scripture is God-breathed and is valuable for teaching the truth...' Paul wrote this when there was no New Testament, only the Old.

"In August of 2020, we will celebrate ten years of the WBCA. We must not celebrate in one day, but over a week.

"Any Christian that says that speaking in tongues is evil or unacceptable is a wicked Christian. Read I Cor 12, 13 and 14. These three chapters are meant to be read together. Try it.

"Who is not a racist? Raise your hand. We are all racists. The only ones who have ever called me a nigger are blacks. If a white man says it to you, you call him a racist. We are all racists. I am black and I have a right to vote for a black man, but if a white man says he will vote for a white man, he is a racist? We are all racists.

"The alliance is good. It unites us all. But if we go against the word of God, then he will disallow it, as he did with those at Babel. They were in wicked unity. We need to work for unity, but it must be based on the word of God. If not, God will make sure we become confused, just like at Babel. If my message offends you, it's okay; when you see me, just love me and say you're not going to listen to anything I say. Any unity we are building outside the word of God, he will stop it."

I said, 'I enjoy this, but if you will help me not enjoy it, I'll quit.' He can do surgery. He did surgery on me. I looked at the calendar and chose a day two weeks in the future. When we got to that day I was in withdrawal for the first day, but that was all. After that, there was no more withdrawal. He can do it.

"I used to be a real sinner. I used to curse people out while I was driving. I would say, 'Get out of your car and show me that finger.' It's different now. I am different now. God can do that. It was a

change that happened on the inside. If you get mad at God and start to act out, you are still a man or woman of God and the devil knows it. I found myself in jail, where I met these guys. One was a dope dealer. I never told them I was a preacher. They had a Bible and were looking in Revelation for an earthquake. I showed it to them and all three of them wept. I told them that, when I got out, I was gonna go back to what I was doing, but that God was calling them. They wept and called on Jesus.

"A man, I don't remember who, once said that the number of those who were saved and remained Christians after 20 years was 11% (These were of people saved at a Billy Graham crusade). What God said to me to do was to clean people's shoes (foot washing serves no practical purpose today, since people don't were sandals and walk everywhere they go), clean toilets, and preach. So that is what I do. What God has impressed upon me is an awakening. That is why I am so interested in history. If we would see an awakening, there are

things that must be addressed. The Whole Body of Christ Alliance is doing that.

"The Azusa street revival began before there was a Pentecostal awakening because the Baptists and the Methodists were praying for revival. Often the very people who pray for revival are the same people who reject it when it comes. The P'rushim (Pharisees) prayed for Messiah to come, but then rejected Jesus. The same thing happened with the Brownsville revival. It was the same way at Azusa Street.

"You can preach, but if someone's baby is sick, you need God's power. For there to be an awakening, there must be an awakening, in other words, a light must come on. I can get a revelation and share it with you, but  $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$  cannot give you a revelation. Only God does that. Praise God for that 11%. We all (Baptists, Presbyterians, Methodists, Messianics Pentecostals Nazarenes) have been taught to use the 'Sinner's Prayer.' I'm not saying it is wrong, but if all you are getting is 11% something is wrong. Where it ends up all too often is just being something they're saying because there is no revelation. 'Where there is no revelation, the people perish. They don't know they have to repent, or much of anything else because we almost never follow up like Jesus said to do and make them into disciples; they're just being told to 'repeat after me.'

"That's what we do, go forward with what everybody else does, but there is no revelation and, therefore, no power. I will **never** tell someone that they are saved. Look back in history in the days of the first great awakening. George Whitfield was asked how many were saved and he answered, 'I will tell you in a few years when I come back from England.' **Look for the fruit!** 

"I won't say that I will never use the sinner's prayer; I'm just saying it is not my M.O. I did not get saved in church. I got saved in my bedroom with 1/16 ounce of dope in my pocket. That was the time Jesus showed up. Why don't I try to have people be saved as I was saved? I do tell them about it, and the story causes many to weep because they do want to meet the King of kings.

"I want to see God show up and do things. In Brownsville, God showed up and a man's severed hand grew back. For this kind of thing, we must give up some things.

"if you use the sinner's prayer with 15 people and five stay saved, great, but that is not the way it was done years ago in churches. We have to slay some of the golden calves. II Peter says if the righteous scarcely saved, what about the unrighteous? We need to pray, 'God, show me that golden calf and I will slay it.' I was doing meth and God saved me. That is when my forever wife left me saying, 'You are not the man I married.' Later on, however, she did get saved. When I got saved, I was in my bedroom calling out to Jesus. I told my friend about it and he said, 'You got saved.' I used to read my Bible smoking a joint and the Lord said, 'You gonna smoke that and go to church?' I looked through the Bible to see where it said it was a sin to smoke pot. At the time I did not now about witchcraft and Pharmakeia and all, so I questioned the Lord about it. I said, 'If something is wrong with smoking it, I wanna know. I don't care what religious people thing, but I do care what you think '

"I was reading Romans smoking a joint and I read where Pail said in 14:14, 'I know, and am persuaded by the Lord Jesus, that there is nothing unclean of itself.' I got really happy. Then I read, and received the revelation, 'but to him that esteemeth any thing to be unclean, to him it is unclean.' Woops! There it was!

"With the 'Lord's Prayer,' Jesus was trying to get us to dialogue with the Father because we just use his words without engaging him. Don't forget Witches and warlocks use the things written in the Bible more than any other book because those things are powerful. If we are doing the same thing and we are his people, what does that mean for us? In the 'prayer of Jabez,' it says Jabez was more honorable. Why? He was more honorable because he spoke directly to God; He engaged him. That is what David did. He did not wait to go to temple for it. Jesus told us that when the sheep are separated form the goats, some will say, 'I healed and Cast out devils in your name,' but he will say, 'I never knew you.'

"How can we announce thousands were saved when there is no fruit? For unity we must lay down some of these things, slay these golden calves. There is a lost world out there. Jesus was willing to be rejected. I don't like it; it hurts my feelings. If we are gonna reach a dying world, we have to be rejected.

"People reject revival because they do not want to change. At Azusa street, people who claimed to be the people of God worked to bring that incredible revival to a halt because they did not want blacks and whites worshiping together. In the 60s and 70s the church prayed for revival and the Jesus Hippy movement came. Those 'Jesus Freaks' were told to get out of the church. They rejected revival that they had prayed for because they refused to change. At one of the most incredible revivals of the 20<sup>th</sup> century in Brownsville, Florida, the mainstream denominations rejected the revival that they had prayed for because they could not come together, inasmuch as they did not want a Messianic Rabbi preaching to 'their sheep.' That is what stopped that revival. What will you do if homosexuals come into your church? We must be careful how we treat those Jesus died for."

Rescuing someone who continues to make poor choices is not called love. It's called enabling. Stop enabling and refuse to be a safety net, so they can grow up.

- 11: Malkitzedek (Melcizedek)
- 12: The question was, "where in the Bible does one find, 'the seven deadly sins?'

The answer is that the "seven deadly sins" is not a biblical term, but rather a term from English literature. The term "seven deadly sins" is not found in the Bible. Nevertheless, they are Pride, covetousness, Lust, Anger, Gluttony, Envy and Sloth (laziness). These are often confused with the "works of the flesh" that Paul the apostle enumerates in Gal 5:19-21, but as one quickly sees, there are 17 of these, not seven. These are adultery fornication, uncleanness (impurity, for instance a nasty mouth), lasciviousness (lewdness, debauchery), idolatry, witchcraft (Greek: Pharmakeia - sorcery/drugs), hatred, variance (contentiousness discord), or emulations (jealousy), wrath (outbursts & fits of rage; anger of itself is not a sin), strife (selfish ambition), sedition (dissentions), heresies, envy, murder, drunkenness, reveling (revelry, orgies) and there are 18 if you count "And the like."

I have seen that some folks get Prov 6:16-19 mixed up with the seven deadly sins because there are seven of them: "There are six things. yes, seven are an abomination (anything hateful or disgusting) to him: A proud look (or haughty eyes, ie pride), a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that devises wicked plans, feet quick to rush into evil, a false witness, whoever sows discord between brothers.


Because there are seven of them, people confuse them with the seven deadly sins, but as you can see, only pride is on both lists.
